STS ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Admission requires the presentation of the following documents:

- 1. A letter of recommendation from the Religious or the Local Ordinary, indicating that the candidate has hitherto given proof that he possesses the necessary intellectual, moral and religious qualities. For lay people this letter can come from your parish priest;
- 2. The diploma or certificate of secondary studies (high school), which would permit enrolment for university studies;
- 3. The diploma or certificate of his/her philosophical studies as well as documentation of marks. This is compulsory for ordinary students and those who wish to be ordained as deacons and priests;
- 4. A certification of adequate knowledge of English. A B2 European Standard of English Certificate indicating adequate knowledge of English is required.
- 5. The completed official enrolment form and Personal Data form provided by the Registrar's office. (Can be obtained from the Website).
- 6. Your original current Passport and Visa.
- 7. Two (2) Passport sized photographs with name printed on the back in bold faced, capital letters.

The admission is preceded by an interview with the Principal.

Knowledge of Latin is a prerequisite for obtaining the Bachelor Degree. Students who have no documented evidence of having passed a Latin test should undergo a test and be approved before they can sit for the baccalaureate exam.

Ordinarily, students are not admitted to courses already in progress.

CATEGORIES OF STUDENTS

- 1. Ordinary students: fulfil all the requirements needed to obtain the Bachelor's Degree.
- 2. Extraordinary students: attend all or some of the courses and take the respective examinations. They either have no interest in the Bachelor's degree, or do not have all the requirements to obtain it.
- 3. Guest students: are allowed by the Principal to attend one or more courses for a limited period of time.
- 4. "Fuori corso" (*extra cursum*): have completed the attendance of courses but have not fulfilled all the requirements to obtain the final academic degree.

ACADEMIC FEES

The academic fees include all the expenses related to the enrolment, attendance at classes, examinations, and the use of the Library.
